Established in 1948, Bishop Manogue Catholic High School is a four-year, coeducational, college preparatory school in the Diocese of Reno, Nevada. It is a separately incorporated, non-profit Diocesan school, operated under the authority of the Diocesan Bishop, who serves on the Board of Directors.

The only Catholic high school in Northern Nevada, Bishop Manogue is a faith-based community working together for the education of all students. Catholic values and ideals are the basis for all instruction and interaction. The school community, together with parents, alumni, and benefactors, fosters an environment that supports academic achievement, spiritual growth, self-motivation, extra-curricular involvement and Christian service.

THE SCHOOL

BMCHS serves students in grades 9-12, who commute from a wide geographical area to attend. BMCHS operates on a modified block semester system. Each class meets 2-3 times a week for 55-85 minutes.

THE FACULTY AND ADMINISTRATION

The faculty and administration includes the President, Principal, Director of Academic Affairs, Dean of Students, Associate Dean of Academic Affairs and Student Services, Director of Advancement, Director of Finance, Director of Athletics, Director of Admissions, Chaplain, Director of Campus Ministry, Assistant to the President and Human Resources, 2 counselors, support staff and 44 lay teachers. Seventy percent of all faculty members are club moderators and/or coaches, many in more than one capacity. Some of our administrators also teach a class.

INTEGRATED LEARNING CENTER

BMCHS is equally committed to addressing the needs of students requiring special services. Services are provided on various levels depending on a student’s specific need, and an individualized plan is developed for that student.

INTERNATIONAL PROGRAM

BMCHS believes in the value of a global education, of broadening our community’s awareness and acceptance of other cultures. We offer a diploma program, where students attend BMCHS for four years; a semester or year-long exchange program; and English Language Learning classes in Chinese, French, Spanish and Russian. Each of our international students receives a peer mentor, or I Friend, and a separate academic counselor to see to all international student needs.

CAMPUS MINISTRY

The Campus Ministry department at BMCHS endeavors to bring the Gospel message of Jesus Christ to students, faculty, staff, parents, and alumni of Bishop Manogue through retreats, education, service, liturgy, prayer, community, fellowship, and worship. Campus Ministry helps the BMCHS community connect with God on a deeper level and grow in our Catholic faith. Campus Ministry also tracks and facilitates Christian Service requirements for our students.

ATHLETIC PROGRAMS

Eighty percent of the BMCHS student body participates in school athletic programs. BMCHS is a member of the 4A division of the Nevada Interscholastic Activities Association, and is well-represented in Nevada’s “Big School” athletic arena. Our athletes participate in 21 different men’s and women’s programs.

STUDENT CLUBS AND ACTIVITIES

BMCHS provides 24 clubs and groups to enhance the overall development of our students. Our clubs allow students to pursue established interests, and also to develop new ones. Throughout the year, students foster and maintain the Miner Spirit with a variety of dances, rallies and assemblies coordinated by the BMCHS Student Leadership Class.

FINE AND PERFORMING ARTS

BMCHS offers programs in music, drama and the visual arts. The department supports a fall spirit band, winter drama production, Christmas concert, Live Nativity Scene, and spring musical to complement curricular offerings in band, strings, guitar, choir, art foundations, drawing, sculpture, painting, bead art, fabric art, and graphic design.

TUITION COSTS

\$550 Registration fee and \$8,750 base tuition. \$12,208 is the total cost to educate one student. For those who pay the entire cost of education the additional \$3,458 is considered a tax-deductible donation.

FINANCIAL AID

Approximately 25 percent of students who attend BMCHS receive some sort of financial aid, provided through tuition assistance and scholarships.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

Students must earn a minimum of 28.5 credits in the required and elective courses as listed below. BMCHS students must also pass the Nevada High School Proficiency Examination in Reading, Writing, Science, and Mathematics during their sophomore, junior or senior year and complete 100 Christian Service hours in order to graduate.

COUNSELING DEPARTMENT

Our counselors provide academic and personal counseling, college planning services and a comprehensive parent education program.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

BMCHS offers 14 Advanced Placement (AP) courses in U.S. History, U.S. Government, Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Science, Statistics, Calculus, Physics, English Literature, English Language, Psychology, French, Spanish and Studio Art. AP courses give high school students the opportunity to receive advanced placement and/or credit in college. Students enrolled in an AP Course are required to take the AP exam in May.

HONORS COURSES

BMCHS offers 13 Honors courses in U.S. History, U.S. Government, World History, Biology, Chemistry, Spanish, Pre-Calculus, Physics, Algebra I, Geometry, French, Algebra II/Trigonometry and English. Honors courses are designed to challenge students in more rigorous course work and to advance the academic achievement of students.

GRADE POINT AVERAGE

GPA is determined on a 4.0 system beginning in the 9th grade. A total cumulative GPA is the GPA for all classes taken during a student’s high school career. The core GPA is the GPA of all classes taken in English, Math, Science, and Social Studies. The weighted GPA is the GPA that takes into consideration a student’s honors and AP courses and awards an additional 0.25 credit for honors courses and 0.5 for AP courses.
