



BISHOP MANOGUE COMPLETES NAAS ACCREDITATION PROCESS

Every few years, all secondary programs submit themselves to energetic self-study through a process known as accreditation. In Nevada, the organization that regulates this procedure is NAAS (Northwest Association of Accredited Schools). The self-study process gives a school the opportunity to scrutinize its current programs and develop master plans for the next five to six years. After a time creating its own self-study document, a 51-page distillation of the school program, the association then sends a visiting team to validate the report and accredit the school for another term.

Bishop Manogue's accreditation visit took place on April 11th and 12th. Following meetings with various school committees, student groups, and through class observations, the committee arrived at the hoped-for conclusion: "Bishop Manogue Catholic High School has satisfactorily completed the requirements of the school improvement accreditation process and

will be recommended to the Northwest Association of Accredited Schools for full accreditation."

The visiting team selected numerous areas for commendation in their report, including:

- Stakeholders were actively involved, contributed thoughtfully, and developed strong buy-in to the school improvement process.
- The steering committee chairs and steering committee, with strong leadership from the principal, provided exemplary organization and leadership.
- The action plans are detailed and measurable.
- Action plan goals are comprehensive, timelines are specific and responsibilities are designated.
- Small class size and positive teaching environment.
- Providing opportunities for community outreach.
- Incorporating a consistent message that focuses on educating the total person.

The accreditation process, which was under the direction of Tim Jaureguito '71 (Assistant Principal for Student Services) and Laurie Crawford (English Department Chair), involved the combined efforts of faculty, staff, parents, students and administration for approximately 18 months prior to the visit.

BISHOP MANOGUE ALUM SWORN IN AS DISTRICT JUDGE

Brian Sandoval, Bishop Manogue Catholic High School Graduate, class of 1981 was sworn in as U.S. District Judge for the district of Nevada in November 2005. After graduating from BMCHS, Brian attended the University of Nevada and graduated in 1986 with his bachelor's degree in Foreign Affairs. He then moved on and graduated from Ohio State University College of Law.

In 1994 Brian was elected to the Nevada State Assembly and then re-elected in 1996. He resigned from the Nevada State Assembly after being appointed to the Nevada Gaming Commission in 1998. In 1999, Brian was named Chairman of the Nevada Gaming Commission, which made him the youngest person to hold the position.



Brian won the election for Attorney General in 2002. As the state's chief law enforcement officer, his office served as the state's primary law enforcement agency that investigated and prosecuted those who violated the state law, provided legal counsel to state agencies, and represented the state in court. Brian resigned as Attorney General to accept the U.S. Federal District Judgeship.

Thursday, February 23, 2006 in the main gym at Bishop Manogue, Brian Sandoval's investiture as U.S. District Court Judge took place. Brian is one of the youngest U.S. district court judges in the country and among the youngest in Nevada's history. Brian lives in Reno with his wife Kathleen and their three children James, Madeline, and Marisa.

TEACHING IN AFRICA

Bishop Manogue graduates Jenifer Bailey '01 and Austin Miller '01 have been in Mozambique, Africa teaching. Both Jen and Austin are traveling through the Institute for International Cooperation and Development (IICD) which is a nonprofit organization with thousands of volunteers who work in community projects in Africa, Central America, and Brazil.

Jen graduated in 2005 from Fordham University in New York with a bachelor's degree in psychology. While in Africa Jen has been working with the Hope Program. The Hope Program is a part of IICD which works with the locals and the fight against the HIV/AIDS epidemic. Jen has also been teaching high school English and health education and has been instrumental in starting women's programs.

Austin graduated in 2005 from College of the Holy Cross in Massachusetts with a degree in political science. Austin is teaching English and teaching techniques at the Teacher Training College. The Teacher Training College is a program through IICD where students develop skills to educate the next generation. He also works with the agriculture project which grows plants that produce nuts which are turned into bio-diesel products.

Before leaving for Africa Jen and Austin had to go through six months of preparation which included language and practical training and instructor skills training. Both Jen and Austin have been in Africa for approximately five months and are due home this summer.

SPEECH AND DEBATE SEND 5 TO NATIONALS

The Bishop Manogue Debate team came into existence 11 years ago, first an affiliate of National Forensics League and subsequently a Chapter, two years later. Our first tournament participation boasted only one competitor, Ms. Riva Kaufer '96. When Riva won the first place trophy in Lincoln Douglas debate and the first place speaker point trophy, the newly formed BMCHS debate team was off to a rollicking start. In the following years our team has qualified Galen Mitchell '97, Christian Lockwood '99, Alan Kessler '00, Joseph Mulvihill '00, Catherine Leon '99(a two time qualifier), Graham Culbertson '04, Drew Guyton '04, and Robert Egan '04 for the prestigious National Competitor positions. This year marks a milestone in our history.

The 2006 Debate team has achieved an unprecedented five qualifiers. Bill O'Mara, the local attorney who first suggested the need for Bishop Manogue to have a debate team, is understandably proud of the winning tradition that his idea has forged. Attending the Speak Sweetly fund-raiser this year, Bill observed, "I can remember when we held this with only ten people in the audience and we judged it a success."

Dan Week, a graduating senior, is thirsty for info. That's why he qualified. He has limitless energy and even more questions. He can be seen grilling his history teachers for angles and expertise. He owes a lot of what he knows to his parents, John and Sandy. Additionally, he is always taking advantage of Mr. Preston's, Bishop Manogue's AP government teacher, expertise.

Dan will be going to Nationals in the Public Forum debate event along with his partner, Junior, Chad Kales. An interesting fact about Dan is, he was very reluctant to try debate and was resistant to two years of prompts to do so from Dr. Roer, religion teacher and Mrs. Landes, communication, debate, and art teacher at BMCHS. He readily states that he regrets putting the decision off for so long. Dan is a past recipient of the "Rookie of the Year" award in 2005 and the "Edward Fauss Memorial Debater of the Year" award in 2006.

Kaye Emia is a remarkable example of what a drive for excellence and remarkable self-discipline can do for a student. Kaye came to us from the Philippines with English as her second language, only four years ago. She joined the debate team very reluctantly at the urging of her Uncle Kim. Each semester she would be given the choice to quit, but she persevered. Her self discipline and focus has earned her a place at Nationals in Dramatic Interpretation. She will be performing a 10 minute cutting from the novella, HIROSHIMA, by Lawrence Yep. She

has served this year as the Uber Captain, or Captain of all Captains, and is respected and admired by her peers. As a result of her positive influence her team has voted her "Most Inspirational Debater" for an unprecedented three years.

Chadwick Kales is an accomplished pianist, student and Forensics competitor. Chad qualified this year in Public Forum debate with his partner Dan Week. Last year, Chad received the "Summer Studies" award with his twin sister and fellow forensics competitor, Sabrina Kales. Chad and Sabrina attended a summer debate camp in Utah on a grant given to award recipients. Sabrina and Chad finished third over-all at the camp and brought

back their newly acquired expertise to share with the entire Public Forum team. This year Chad was co-captain of the Public Forum team and an active participant of our Kairos retreat program as well as being enrolled in the AP programs, newspaper, and yearbook classes here at Bishop Manogue. This year, Chad will receive the Ed Fauss award and will return next year with new goals and challenges.

Spencer Van Dyck came to the debate team mid-year from Carson High School. But when you listen to him speak, you can detect traces of a southern drawl which betrays an earlier, pre-Nevada history.

Spencer took a surprisingly short time to break through to Nationals with only two tournaments of experience under his belt. His performance at Speak Sweetly, our annual fundraising featured his newly discovered comic skills.


JoAnn Allison '55




