Proactive Measures in Response to COVID-19

Dear Bishop Manogue Community,

Our school leadership is continuing to work with local health agencies to monitor COVID-19 in our area and enforce the necessary protocol. We have proactively submitted a proposal to the Nevada Department of Education to initiate virtual learning days should the school face closure due to precautions surrounding COVID-19. Per the State of Nevada, all virtual learning must be approved to be considered valid days of instruction. We are awaiting approval and will notify our community as soon as we receive a decision. *(In the 2018/19 school year, Bishop Manogue received approval by the State to use virtual learning days to account for class time missed due to school closures caused by inclement weather. After further discussion, that approval was rescinded, which now requires our organization to re-submit another proposal to use virtual learning.)*

In addition to elevated cleaning and sanitation measures, heightened travel restrictions, and limiting on-campus events, Bishop Manogue is stressing to all students and staff to stay home at the first sign of any sickness. We are committed to being as accommodating as possible to ensure students and staff will not face unfair penalties should they miss school or work due to illness.

At this time, we want to extend our appreciation and cooperation as we work quickly and closely with our county and state officials. We encourage you to do what's best for you and your family in these unprecedented times and will work with our school community to promote and enforce healthy learning environments. Please continue to keep all who are impacted by COVID-19 in your prayers.
